



MIT Endicott House Chooses Ecovim as Their Newest Green Initiative

MIT Endicott House Conference Center recently purchased and installed an Ecovim Dehydrator as their method of choice to divert food waste from the solid waste stream. They purchased Ecovim because it is the “cutting edge” in garbage dehydration technology. The unit will dehydrate 66 lbs of organic waste in 9-10 hours reducing the material by 85-90%. The water, that is evaporated and then condensed passes through a carbon filter as it drains from the machine, can be used for watering plants. The dry, sterile, organic biomass will be used in their composting program. “We are extremely excited about reducing organic waste and the impact to the Endicott House gardens.”
